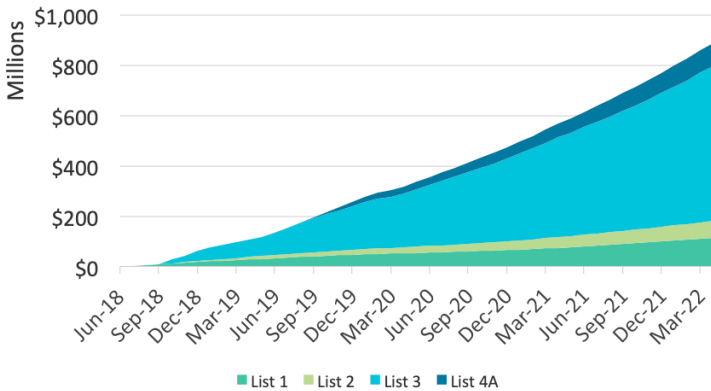

THE LATEST NUMBERS: 301 TARIFFS HITTING OREGON ECONOMY HARD

- According to the most recent data, Oregon businesses have paid an extra \$889 million in new Section 301 taxes imposed by the Trump Administration – and continued by the Biden Administration.
- Oregon businesses paid an estimated \$497 million in extra Section 301 tariffs during the Trump administration and have paid an estimated \$391 million during the Biden administration. On a monthly basis, Section 301 tariff costs for Oregon companies are 63% higher under the Biden administration.
- Section 301 tariff exclusions eliminated an estimated \$115 million in extra tariffs on Oregon businesses. However, nearly all of these exclusions expired at the end of 2020. The Biden administration has not initiated a robust Section 301 exclusion review process despite Congressional calls for one.

President Biden should successfully negotiate with our trading partners and end these costly and harmful tariffs. Oregon jobs are on the line.
